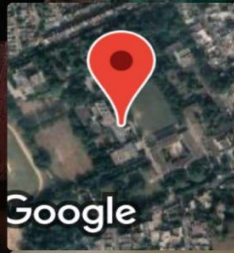
1. Filling the AQAR of the college for the year 2021-2022 was the top most priority. The team is already working on it and the work will be accomplished soon.
2. As far as institutional preparedness for these is concerned, our affiliating university Panjab University Chandigarh has not registered for Academic Bank of Credits as yet. But we have already initiated the process of enrolling our students at the ABC website. Around 1000 students have successfully created ABC ids and as soon as our university is registered on the portal, our students will be able to reap the benefits of ABC.
3. Institutional preparedness and views on digital learning can be achieved through enrolment of students and faculty into already implemented Digital learning platforms such as ODL and SWAYAM. The benefits are manifold. National or International Level Best Quality Contents are available. Learning is free of cost and students get certificates of the particular course at a very nominal fee.
4. The college is already running varied courses like B.A, BSC (M), BSC (NM), BBA, BCA, BCOM and 11 PG programmes. Interdisciplinary customised undergraduate degrees can be easily designed and incorporated. The college has already initiated 5 certificate courses – Computer Aided Accounting, GST Application, Creative Writing and Content Development, Business Etiquette and Professionalism and Digital Marketing. These are open to all streams. We look forward to multidisciplinary vibrant education set up.
5. All members unanimously agreed that Industry Institute Collaboration is a must. There is a huge gap between the requirements of the industry and the skill set they receive from our students. There is a need to analyse the job requirements of the varied industry of Ludhiana and curate specific courses in addition to guiding the students towards attaining the eligibility for the jobs available.
6. Prof Neelam Bhardwaj elaborated on institutional preparedness on academic research and internationalisation of higher education. The Institution Innovation Council (IIC) has been established in the college for promoting different activities related to research, innovation, IPR. etc. startup and entrepreneurships. Faculties and students are the members of IIC. The IIC Council conducts quarterly meetings in every quarter to plan the quarterly activities and review quarterly conducted activities. Expert Talk will be held in Quarter 1 under the umbrella of “My Story” session. A workshop on "IPR, Critical Thinking, Problem Solving, Ideation, Innovation Design" for faculty and students will be conducted in blended mode. Field visit to pre-incubation units will be arranged for students in nearby industries.
7. As far as institutional preparedness for introducing the Indian Knowledge System is concerned, Dr Kajla suggested that a dedicated cell of IKS be set up to research, promote and disseminate knowledge about it. Role of languages and social sciences will be

augmented to revive the dying languages. Short term courses on learning/teaching various Indian languages can be coordinated. Shloka Ucharan and spoken Sanskrit competitions can be formulated to rejuvenate classical language Sanskrit. Interstate educational tours will be organized to know the culture and tradition of other states. Interstate cultural competitions, webinars, conferences can be arranged. Workshops and internships on various kalas of ancient culture can be introduced by inviting local artisans. Free Yoga camps will be organized in collaboration with local Yoga sansthans to lead healthy, stress-free life and enhancing concentration power.

8. Prof Anamika proposed a course or mechanism through which value education and community welfare education can be imparted to the youth. This would also result in strengthening the emotional quotient of the students.
9. Incharge of Career Counselling and Placement Cell Dr Sajla talked about Institutional efforts to promote employability. The career counselling and placement cell also plans to hold career counselling seminars/workshops in collaboration with government agencies District Bureau of Employment and Enterprises (DBEE) in the coming months. The college is also planning to make a conference room/placement office where companies HRs who come for placement can have group discussions and interviews. The cell also plans to invite experts for training students for various soft skills required for placement.
10. Principal Dr Tanvir Likhari discussed her vision on the quality roadmap of the institution. The first priority is AQAR 21-22 followed by NAAC inspection. The college needs better social media outreach. Our website needs overhauling and we can buy a YouTube subscription to reach out to students in blended learning. A High Achievers' Club will be introduced which will work on chiselling them into better personalities by engaging them into various activities. The Indian Knowledge Cell can be established to revive our indigenous learning systems and dying languages.

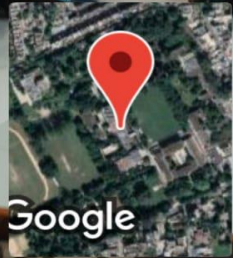
The following decisions were taken.
