PLAN FOR QUALITY ENHANCEMENT

The internal quality cell (IQAC) of S.C.D. Govt. College, Ludhiana with an aim of total quality management (TQM) in all aspects of higher education conducted its regular meetings and discussions and enlisted an agenda for striving towards achievements of quality enhancement. The internal quality assurance cell held a special meeting to assess the achievements made during the last five years after the visit of the peer team to spill over impact on the quality of teaching. The various plans undertaken during the year have found their destination (please refer part-c of QAR of IQAC of this college, 2007) as under:

 - Basic courses on computers funded by PTA-fund for economically backward students. It is co-sponsored by MLA-LAD scheme under the guidance of local MLA Mr. Harish Rai Dhanda.
 - B.C.A Bachelor of Computer Application a (three year degree) course affiliated by Punjab University, Chandigarh.
 - PGDCA – Post-Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications (1 year, course)
- Continuation of PTOSS – Punjab Training on Soft-Skills program assisted by HEIS and SCD-ICT society.
- Continuing computerization of control library with internet facility.
- Extension lectures through edu-sat (camps)
- Establishment of two full-fledged computer labs.
- The software's for education and secretarial practices have been purchased.
- The currency check and counting machines have been installed.

- To suggest restructuring of internal education system to suit the need of global requirements.

3. INNOVATIONS IN CURRICULAR DESIGNS AND TRANSACTION:

The students of B.Sc. in industrial microbiology (IMB); M.A. Geography; M.A. Economics, and M.Com undertake research projects and On Job Training (OJT) courses. The UG/PG students of other faculties are also encouraged to write project reports on the assigned themes.

The faculty members represent UG and PG board of studies in their respective subjects and on administration and management to keep upgradation and modernization of the curriculum to be taught and the regulations of academic ethics to be maintained.

The department of Geography has introduced semester system instead of an annual examination system. This facility would be extended to other PG-courses from 2009-10 and to UG-courses from 2010-11.

4. INTER DISCIPLINARY PROGRAMS STARTED:

The students of B.Sc. IMB are taught Biostatistics by the Department of Mathematics and Commerce. The subject of environmental education – a non-credit compulsory course for first year students of BA/B.Com/B.Sc and BCA (TDC) is taught by teachers from the Departments of Botany, Chemistry, Geography, Hindi, Physics and Zoology. The subject of history and Culture of Punjab is taught by teachers from the Department of History. Similarly, the subject of English and Punjabi is taught to the entry level UG-students by the teachers of English and Punjabi department. The subject of economics is taught to commerce students at UG and PG-level by teachers of the economics department. Besides

The administrative, finance and examination sections of the college have totally been computerized. The admission to the various entry classes or vertical rise is done as per the directives of the state higher education department and P.U. Chandigarh strictly on merit. These are made public through the admission notice in new papers and the prospectus which is published every year. The annual or semester examinations are external i.e. held by the P.U. Chandigarh during each academic session. The university with the support of the college principal and the faculty conducts examination and evaluate answer sheets. The results are computed by the university which later on publishes it, awards detail marks cards, certificates and the degrees. The DMC's (DMC's) are recorded in registers by examination branches before these are disbursed to students. The degrees are awarded to the students at an annual convocation function.
